## FREE SCHOOL MEALS ARE CHANGING!

## IS YOUR CHILD ELIGIBLE?

**From September 2026 free school meals are changing** and being expanded to allow more children to become eligible. The government are changing their eligibility criteria so that more families can access the benefit and from September any families that are in receipt of Universal Credit will be eligible for a free school meal. Whilst **more children will be eligible**, annual free school meal applications must be made.

Whilst all the details have not yet been confirmed we are asking ALL our families to complete the following Microsoft form so in September we can run a check for our families to see if their children are eligible for free school meals. We are hoping reapplying annually is something we can do on your behalf, so long as ALL families complete the attached Microsoft form.

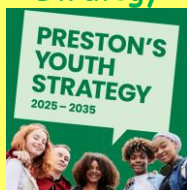

### Free School Meal Holiday Vouchers.

Unfortunately, we can confirm that the free school meal vouchers over holiday periods have now come to an end so there will be no vouchers for May half term or the longer summer break.

### May Half Term Offers

For May half-term 2026 (starting 26th May), many UK restaurants offer free or £1 kids' meals,

#### Key Free/Cheap Kids' Meal Deals (May Half Term 2026):

- **Asda Cafes:** Kids eat for £1 all day, every day, with no minimum adult spend.
- **Bella Italia:** Kids eat free all day on Thursdays and for £1 Sunday-Wednesday (4-6pm).
- **Tesco Cafes:** Kids eat free with any adult purchase (Monday-Friday).
- **Pausa Cafe (Dunelm):** Kids eat free with every £4 adult spend.
- **Morrisons:** Kids eat free all day, every day with an adult meal over £5.
- **Sizzling Pubs:** Kids mains £1 with an adult main (Monday-Friday 3-7 PM)

Biscuits and cakes will be provided and everyone is welcome!

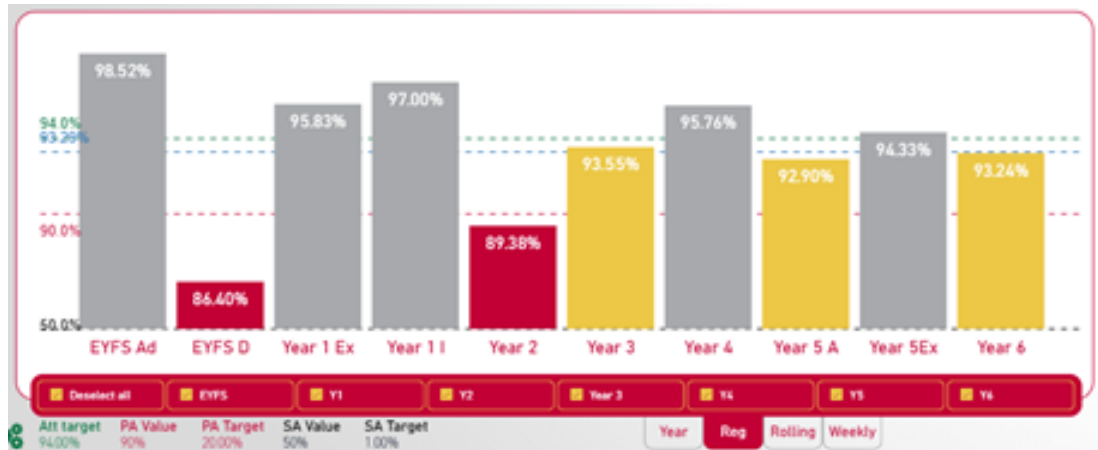
